Monthly Article - WNC Ham Legend

By Doug Davis (KJ4WWN) – I had the pleasure of interviewing Sid Hendricks for this month's article.



Miss Beverly and Sid (W4IOE)

Many ham radio operators who live in the mountains of North Carolina are familiar with the call sign W4IOE (alias W4YK). It belongs to Sid Hendricks and W4YK is the club call sign for the *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club*. Currently, Sid hosts three ham nets on a regular basis.

Sid learned about radios from his father who was an avid ham operator shortly after World War II. When Sid was a kid, he helped his dad build and install wire antennas. However, Sid never got around to getting his license because raising a family came first. It wasn't until he retired in 1999 because of a physical disability, that he decided he had time to learn CW and earn his license.

It wasn't until 2001 when Sid got his first ham license. He qualified with 5 words per minute using Morse Code and a year later earned his General ticket. He earned his Extra License a year after his General license. Sid adopted his father's call (W4IOE) when his Dad passed away.

For the last 10 years, Sid has served the ham community as "Net Control" on the 146.640 Mhz (2 meter band). In the beginning, he called the 2 meter net using a hand-held radio. Now he has a base station and a "Ham Radio Shack" in his house. Moreover, he likes to moderate on the 6 meter and 220 band, as well. In addition, he serves as net control on the 1.25 cm band. That's how he got to know so many different people in such a large geographic area. Consequently, high country hams, as well as those in South Carolina, and the low lands of North Carolina, became familiar with Sid and his courteous, personal, and extremely friendly style.

Furthermore, Sid has served the ham community as a VE manager for several years. As a VE Sid tested and passed at least 50 new hams into the hobby. He remains a VE for consultation. Finally, Sid served as Secretary of the *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club* for 5 or 6 years. These achievements are a tough act to follow because he leads by example.

Besides calling nets, his latest ham interests are digital radio in JT-65, and PSK31.

When asked what makes a good and successful net controller Sid said "to be friendly, keep it moving, and listen and share information with the ham community."

We are all blessed and fortunate to know and hear Sid on the radio on a regular basis. He has become a living legend.

Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club (BRARC)

Radio operators come from all walks of life. Some are students, teachers, pilots, technicians, police officers, doctors, executives, retired military, engineers, you name it.

The *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club (BRARC)* is all of these things. Another key benefit it that they give-back in many ways back to their community. Amateur radio operators at BRARC donate time and equipment to participate with the *Department of Emergency Management*, the *Red Cross*, and *FEMA*. Radio operators practice using their equipment without power from the grid. So during REAL emergencies they can supply the necessary communication to first responders so they can provide help to those who need it. *Hurricane Sandy* was a perfect example. Ham radio operators helped FEMA direct needed supplies and medical attention.

BRARC also provides volunteer community support in a variety of community activities including, parades including the 4th of July, and Christmas parades, walk-a-thons, bike-a-thons, and the Fletcher Flier.

The *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club* also provides daily and weekly forums via what they call "*Nets*." You don't need a ham license to listen to a net - just a radio. These forums include informal sessions or "*rag chews*" that discuss local events or just about any topic.
