- **Transceiver**: Kenwood TS-820S, the last of the great old boat-anchor 35-pound vacuum-tube final (2 6146B's) transceivers. Covers 160-10: no WARC bands. Two hundred watts SSB; 160 CW; also does FSK. Superb receiver with RIT, IF shift, RF attenuator, and a noise blanker that works. Both filters installed. Digital frequency display. 120VAC power. Factory manual, microphone (never used), power cord. No problems with the rig and no physical/cosmetic damage. In the year I've had it, I've worked into Europe, Australia, South America, easily, with the below-antenna.
- **Tuner**: MFJ-941E, with coax to connect to transceiver.

Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club (BRARC)

Radio operators come from all walks of life. Some are students, teachers, pilots, technicians, police officers, doctors, executives, retired military, engineers, you name it.

The *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club (BRARC)* is all of these things. Another key benefit it that they give-back in many ways back to their community. Amateur radio operators at BRARC donate time and equipment to participate with the *Department of Emergency Management*, the *Red Cross*, and *FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency)*. Radio operators practice using their equipment without power from the grid. So during REAL emergencies they can supply the necessary communication to first responders so they can provide help to those who need it. *Hurricane Sandy* was a perfect example. Ham radio operators helped FEMA direct needed supplies and medical attention.

BRARC also provides volunteer community support in a variety of community activities including, parades including the 4th of July, and Christmas parades, walk-a-thons, bike-a-thons, and the Fletcher Flier.

The *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club* also provides daily and weekly forums via what they call "*Nets*." You don't need a ham license to listen to a net - just a radio. These forums include informal sessions or "*rag chews*" that discuss local events or just about any topic.
