Carl Stover [KW4EO] announced that his upcoming classes on electronics and radio have been moved to the "big house" in Jackson Park where the club meetings are held. They were moved to have more room and more time to set up and take down equipment required for the classes. He thanked the Salvation Army for hosting the classes from November through February.

MARCH 14: The March classes will be on making good electrical connections - soldering, crimping, spot welding. This will be a bit of instruction, but primarily every student completing 25 to 50 connections of various types, a real hands-on experience! All materials will be supplied

at no cost. Soldering /crimping equipment will be available but if you have any of your own, please feel free to bring them to get some additional practice! We will start with heavier connections (radio power wiring using heavy soldering iron or soldering gun), then move on to small connections (soldering pencil type iron), and finally spot welding demonstration for battery packs. Then Crimping tools of various types including those for coax connectors and Molex connectors as well as conventional splices & terminals. This will be a two session class to get everyone plenty of practice. This class is also a great one for any youngsters that might have interest - they are welcome! MARCH 21: (Part two of the above class.)

The **North Carolina QSO Party** will be Sunday, Feb 26th from 10:00am-8:00pm. The BRARC will be one of the Bonus Stations this year, operating as N4G, with SSB operations from the club shack and CW operations from the shack of Steve Smith [KC5F]. There will be a training day at the club shack on Saturday, Feb 25th at 10:00am. (Danny Rector [NA4X] passed around a signup sheet for operators for the SSB station.)

QSO Party Bonus Station N4W will operate from the Wright Brothers National Memorial in Kitty Hawk and N4T will operate from the Battleship North Carolina moored in Wilmington. The others (N4R, N4I, us and N4H) are spread across the state, with participants trying to collect all six suffixes to spell "WRIGHT". Each bonus station is worth 50 bonus points, and a clean sweep of all six earns an additional 200 bonus points for a possible 500 total as well as a special certificate of achievement. We'll be in demand, so things should be hopping from start to finish. (The QSO Party rules say that operators of the bonus stations cannot also operate from home as participants, so understand that it's either/or and decide which you want to do.)

Club Shack Antennas

Danny Rector [NA4X] shared that on Wednesday, February 1st he and several club members walked through the woods behind the club shack to ascertain the condition of the various HF wire antennas raised years ago. They were able to raise one corner of one, and found that sections of the large loop and delta loop had come down or lost some corner supports and were now held up against nearby tree trunks. Since then, Danny and Michael [AI4GR] pulled down the Zepp and found many damaged parts, wire and lead-in. They suggest that we replace the Zepp and Danny says that for about \$175 we can replace the wire, pulleys, center insulator and ladder line. They talked about putting up a G5RV, but the Zepp gets more wire into the air. It was Moved, Seconded and Approved to rebuild the Zepp, and noted that we have some twinlead in our storage area that might be usable.

PRESENTATION

Treasurer Susann Swann [K9FMZ] introduced tonight's online speaker, Professor James McCanney of Nashville. He spoke briefly on Solar flares and how they disrupt earth transmissions, on Voyager and Pioneer space craft radio signaling and on Marconi oscillators at Jupiter and Saturn and the red shifted signals. Then for the majority of his time he spoke on his "discovery and 2015 publication that the Nazca and Palpa lines in Peru are large interstellar transmission and receiving radio telescope arrays and that there are similarly the same deep space network of these ancient antennas around the world."
