The **Henderson County ARES/AUXCOMM** meets the 4th Monday each month at 6:30pm (except in December) at the State Medical Assistance Team (SMAT) warehouse at 518 S Allen Rd, Flat Rock. They also holds a weekly traffic, information and training net, Wednesdays at 9:00pm (except in December) on the Hendersonville 146.640 MHz repeater, PL tone 91.5. At the April BRARC meeting we plan to have Scott Sutton, Henderson County Emergency Coordinator present a program on ARES/AUXCOMM.

The **WNC Flyer** will be Sunday, June 4th. This is a 100-mile bike ride covering the Brevard and Mills River areas. Operators with 2 meter radios are needed for rest stops and to ride with SAG vehicles. Danny Rector [NA4X], <u>rectordl@bellsouth.net</u>, is coordinating communications. Signup sheets will be passed around at the April and May BRARC meetings.

Field Day will be June 24th-25th. We need to nail down our Field Day operating location by next month. We missed the deadline for getting on the Henderson County Board of Commissioners' agenda to receive approval to stay in Jackson Park overnight. Marty Wood [N4AMW] has offered his home, about a mile and a half from our shack, which has two very good areas for antennas and would have bathroom access from the outside of his house as well as outdoor electricity for the food area. We might experience less AM Broadcast overload and noise, too. We would lose public exposure, although we could still invite the public. All other Field Day Bonuses would still apply. In the past we have not always gotten official permission to stay at Jackson Park overnight and have not yet had problems. (Camping is specifically prohibited, but we don't have anyone camping at Field Day.) Cati Harris offered that working with the Commission is her background and she is willing to call on her contacts to see about getting us the necessary permission should we decide to operate from Jackson Park. No decision was made at tonight's meeting.



Local DMR Repeater

Carl Stover shared the history of our local VHF DMR repeater. Work was started on it some time ago. It has now been set up, tuned and tested, and works fine. It has been in test mode, but now is open and has been mapped to the WNC UHF DMR repeater. Whatever is received by one is transmitted by both, when not in local mode. All UHF options are now also available on the VHF unit. They may link it to the WNC Monday Night Net, but that has not yet been done. The machine is Martin Harris' [W4FOT] property, with Carl's call. Carl has code plugs available for Motorola and TYT radios, as well as a printed handout.

Club Shack Antennas

On Sunday, February 19th, Danny Rector [NA4X] and a group of club members met at the shack and replaced the existing Zepp antenna, as approved at the February club meeting. It's the one you see when you're walking toward the shack building and look straight up. (Wayyy up!)

NC QSO Party Bonus Station N4G

James Reed [KK4JFO] shared that our operation in the NC QSO Party on Sunday, February 26th was "an extremely huge success." This year, rather than competing in the contest, we were N4G, one of six Bonus Stations, and the only one west of Raleigh. The suffixes of the Bonus Stations spelled out "WRIGHT", and participants received extra points for working each one, and even more if they worked all six. With 2 transmitters, we had 1205 SSB and CW QSOs with 73 NC counties, 44 states, 9 Canadian provinces and several other countries. None of the other Bonus stations had over 600 QSOs! We may also be the only Bonus Station to have a specially-designed QSL card available. All had the option of having the Raleigh ARS send QSLs, but they would be their standard cards with a note on the back that it was for station N4W, N4R, etc. James said that many who visited the shack experienced their first contest-style operation and really enjoyed it. He mentioned in particular a newly-licensed Tech and his 10 year-old son who each spent about an hour operating SSB. The son in particular did a great job, as his voice stood out on the air. He didn't want to stop when his hour was up and his dad wanted to operate!



PRESENTATION

Zach Thompson presented a program on *"Severe Weather Preparedness for the Ham Radio Operator"*. He gave us much detailed information, with sections including what to do before an emergency, including why we should want to be prepared, what it entails, how to prepare, and emergency kits. Then he covered what to do when storms are coming and here, as well as after



the storm when we need to continue our situational analysis. He followed up with a discussion of the National Weather Service's SKYWARN Storm Spotter program, and ended by taking questions from in-person and virtual attendees. Those present warmly thanked Zach for an informational program
