Tuesday May 23rd 6:30 -> 8:30pm #3 Building a code plug for select radios Tuesday May 30th 6:30 -> 8:30pm #4 Building a code plug for select radios #3 & #4 (attend one of these depending on your radio)

All classes will be held at the "the Big House" in Jackson Park.

Due to the nature of the material, you will need to complete classes beginning with #1, then #2, Then #3 or #4. You **must** complete #1 & #2 to attend #3 or #4.

This is NOT easy material, so only consider registering if you are willing to put in some study! The classes do not include D-Star, Fusion, or other digital formats – it is strictly a DMR course! Disclaimer! Carl Stover is the primary instructor and is by no means an expert on DMR, so don't expect too much magic!

The **Henderson County ARES/AUXCOMM** meets the 4th Monday each month at 6:30pm (except in December) at the State Medical Assistance Team (SMAT) warehouse at 518 S Allen Rd, Flat Rock. They also holds a weekly traffic, information and training net, Wednesdays at 9:00pm (except in December) on the Hendersonville 146.640 MHz repeater, PL tone 91.5.

The North Carolina Baptist Disaster Relief ministry will be holding a regional training at First Baptist Church in Hendersonville in May. The Comm/IT team has invited club members to tour the communications trailer and meet the communications team members on Friday evening, May 19th beginning at 7:00pm. Please wear your Club or other Amateur radio name badge if you are interested in attending. The comm trailer location has not been determined but will be easy to find or just ask anyone in a yellow shirt for location.

The WNC Flyer will be Sunday, June 4th. This is a 100-mile bike ride covering the Brevard and Mills River areas. Operators with 2 meter radios are needed for rest stops and to ride with SAG vehicles. Danny Rector [NA4X], rectordl@bellsouth.net, is coordinating communications.

Field Day will be June 24th-25th. This year we will hold it at the property of Marty Wood [N4AMW], about a mile and a half from our shack, which has two very good areas for antennas and has bathroom access from the outside of his house as well as outdoor electricity for the food area. We might experience less AM Broadcast overload and noise, too.

Meeting Minutes

Vice President James Reed [KK4JFO] invited members and guests to introduce themselves.

New Member Phil Drake [K4UOK] announced that The North Carolina Baptist Disaster Relief ministry will be at Hendersonville First Baptist Church in May for disaster team training. The Comm/I.T. team has invited club members to stop by the communications trailer on Friday evening May 19th between 7 and 8:30pm to tour the communications trailer and talk with the Comm/IT team members. The trailer is very interesting and will be well worth a visit.

DMR class. Carl Stover [KW4EO] has offered to hold a series of DMR classes for members who are interested. Phil asked for a show of hands of members who had an interest in attending. He counted 12 members present who were interested. He said Carl would be sending information on the classes at a later date.

Marty Wood [N4AMW] presented the award for the NC QSO Party to the club.

James mentioned that Marty Wood has offered the use of his land for the 2023 Field Day. John Helbling [K4JKH] made a motion that BRARC hold its 2023 Field Day event on Marty Wood's property. Marshall Harrison [W4MKH] seconded the motion. Discussion: the vote is only for the 2023 Field Day and does not obligate the club to hold the event there annually. James called for a vote and it was unanimously approved to hold the 2023 Field Day at Mary Wood's property.

Danny Rector [NA4X] mentioned that we need volunteers for communications for the WNC Flyer on June 4. He will be circulating a sign-up sheet at the May club meeting.

Zach Thompson [KM4BLG] informed members about the NC State Parks On The Air event to be held on September 9th and 10th. The event hopes to activate all 107 NC state parks. Clubs and individuals may participate. Zach referred members to www.ncpota.org for more information.

James summarized how POTA works.

James that many of us came to ham radio because of something that intrigued them about it. He cited how valuable amateur radio is for use in disaster situations and mentioned how he used his recently acquired experience with Echolink to contact hams on the west coast near areas hit by storms to check on their safety.

PRESENTATION

James turned control of the meeting to the club's guest speaker, Scott Sutton, who serves as: Henderson County Auxcomm Coordinator, N.C. State Medical Assistance Team (SMAT 600), N.C. COML (Communications Unit Leader), Henderson County Rescue Squad (2451) and is an Amateur Ham Radio Operator [N4LNC] - GENERAL CLASS

Scott reviewed terms common to ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Services). He described various modes of communication that Auxcomm (Auxiliary Emergency Communications) uses, such as Winlink, Shares, VIPER, and DMR.

He recommended a sequence to follow of the FEMA classes relating to the Incident Command System (ICS) in order to be a member of Auxcomm.

Scott noted that the Henderson County ARES group will be participating from its Flat Rock meeting place in a regional event on May 4th.

He invited any interested BRARC members to attend the local monthly ARES meeting on the 4th Monday of each month at 6:30pm at 518 S. Allen Road in Flat Rock at the State Medical Assistance Team (SMAT) warehouse. He noted that the Henderson County ARES group has a weekly net on Wednesday nights at 2100 hrs on the 146.640 frequency.

BRARC members, who are also ARES AUXCOM members, Danny Rector [NA4X] and John Helbling [K4JKH], added comments to Scott Sutton's presentation.

Bob Felt [W4RYF] BRARC/ARES member followed Scott Sutton's presentation by explaining the go kit that he brought to display for the meeting. He also talked about some of his experiences being deployed to areas affected by hurricanes, as well as the Democratic National Convention in Charlotte.

MEETING ENDED

The meeting adjourned at 8:24 pm.
