#### **Meeting Minutes**

President Bill Gunn [KB2GUN] invited guests to introduce themselves.

A sign-up sheet for volunteers for the Hendersonville Fourth of July Parade on Tuesday, July 4<sup>th</sup> was passed around.

A sign-up sheet for those coming to the Field Day barbecue dinner on Saturday, June 24<sup>th</sup> was passed around. Members and their spouses/guests are welcome, starting around 5:30-6:00pm, when the food arrives, and there is no charge. The list was just to get a headcount to know how much food to order from Piggy's.

The club provided communications for the WNC Flyer bicycle ride on Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup>. About 780 riders took part, some from as far away as Europe. Only about 200 riders were local. We had hams at the base, four rest areas and five support vehicles covering the 100-mile course.

#### **PRESENTATION**

Club Vice-President James Reed [KK4JFO] spoke to the group about Field Day 2023.

James emphasized that Field Day is the biggest annual ham radio event in the United States. It allows us to perfect what we need to do in less-than-ideal radio and physical conditions when we are needed for a real emergency.

This year we will hold Field Day at the property of Marty Wood [N4AMW], about a mile and a half from our shack. It's between East Henderson High School and the Hendersonville airport, with easy access and lots of parking. (See Marty's map). The Steering Committee met there last week and scoped out locations for the main operating tent, antennas, generator and food, as well as spots for educational programs and a "Get On The Air" ham station for visitor and new hams to get their feet wet without slowing down the three main operating positions.

After Field Day, please share your thoughts, positive and negative, about this year's location. We had problems this year getting County Commissioner permission to use Jackson Park overnight, but with enough notice should be able to return next year if the club prefers it.

Plan to help with setup on Friday, June 24<sup>th</sup> at 5:00pm, with getting tents and tables set up as the main goal, plus some antennas, if possible. Let James know (jshreed@bellsouth.net, 828-698-3609) if you have a truck to help bring items from Jackson Park. Marty has tables, so we won't need to bring them.

On Saturday at 9:00am we'll continue setting up the antennas, radios and networking to be ready to have three stations on the air from 2:00pm Saturday straight through until 2:00pm on Sunday. We plan to use N3FJP software for logging.

On Sunday after 2:00pm we'll tear down the stations, which always goes fairly quickly. We should be done by 3:30-4:00pm, and will again need trucks to carry things back to the shack.

We'll have operating sign-up sheets at the Field Day site, but if you want to claim time slots in advance as an operator or logger, let James know at <a href="mailto:jshreed@bellsouth.net">jshreed@bellsouth.net</a>. We plan to have two SSB and one CW station on the air through the entire 24-hour period.

Cati Harris [KQ4GKF] will be our media representative and get news out to the local media as well as social media. Martin Harris [W4FOT] will copy the ARRL Field Day Bulletin for a Bonus.


Club members can also operate from their own homes and have their scores aggregated with the W4YK score. Use your own call sign, but when you submit your score to ARRL include **Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club** under "Club or Group Name". The ARRL published results listing will include your individual score, plus a combined score for all entries identified as our club. Note that *spelling is important*, to have your score added to the club's score. (We thought about just using BRARC, but there are several other clubs around the country that identify themselves as BRARC.) One other important item: You cannot work W4YK from your home station if you have your score added to ours or if you participate at our Field Day site.

#### **NEW RF EXPOSURE EVALUATION RULES**

On May 3, 2021, new FCC rules requiring conducting an RF exposure evaluation were made applicable to amateur licensees. A 2-year transition period ended on May 3, 2023. All licensees must now conduct evaluations of their current station and reassess compliance when making changes to their stations that would affect exposure going forward.

The rules now require amateur radio operators to perform station evaluations. We are no longer categorically excluded from certain aspects of the RF exposure rules, and can no longer avoid performing an exposure assessment simply because we transmit below a given power level.

The ARRL website features an <u>RF Exposure landing page</u> with resources, such as an RF exposure calculator, the entire RF Safety section from the 100<sup>th</sup> Edition of the *ARRL Handbook*, a video explaining the topic, FAQs about the subject, and more. These tools and resources are available to the public without an ARRL membership or website account.
