Meeting Minutes

President Bill Gunn [KB2GUN] called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Members recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Susann Swan [K9FMZ] gave the Treasurer's report for the month of September, 2023.

Upcoming events were discussed and are included above.

The club is selling our Icom IC-718 HF Transceiver, which has been replaced with an IC-7300. The IC-718 was offered for \$350 including an HM-219 hand microphone and the digital interface cables we have used with it. There was only one person interested in it, so the Treasurer will contact him to verify he is still interested. If not, we previously said we would offer it online for a higher amount.

Marty Wood [N4AMW] still has club t-shirts available in most sizes for \$10 each.

Brandy Cooolidge [N1HO] reminded us of the national test of the Emergency Awareness System to show up on our phones, televisions and radios tomorrow between 2:20 and 2:50pm.

PRESENTATION

Susann Swan introduced tonight's speaker, Mark Waldrop [KE4WA], joining us via Zoom from Moncks Corner, SC. His topic was Amateur Radio and Artificial Intelligence. Mark presented this topic at the QSO Today Virtual Ham Expo on the weekend of September 9th and 10th.

Mark began by saying there is a collision between amateur radio and artificial intelligence, that he views as "Frequency Meets Function". Although he had topics prepared, he said the Question & Answer session afterward would be even more informative.

His major points were "What is AI?", "What is Amateur Radio?", "Why Combine Them?" and "What's in the Future?". He said AI includes Machine Learning, Data Analytics and Real World Application. Amateur Radio involves Personal Communications, Emergency Response and



Community-Building. Examples of ways they are being combined include Signal Enhancement, Emergency Modeling and Community Engagement, and gave examples of each.

The Future includes Technical Challenges, Ethical Considerations and Future Prospects. For now, he suggested we could get started with AI by trying out the ChatGPT mobile applications available for cell phones or going to the website <u>https://chat.openai.com/</u> and trying it out. It requires an account to be set up, but is then free for the basic version. The fancier version costs about \$20/month, and Mark said the difference in writing was about equal to comparing middle school writing to college writing, but that the database behind both versions is the same.
